

About Lot Numbers

Lot Numbering Style:

If you need to track lots, you can specify the numbering scheme Netbooks should use. For the numbering, enter how you want the numbers displayed.

The numbering format can include numbers, letters, dashes, and dates:

| Use | To | Example |
|------------------------|---|---|
| # (number sign) | Indicate each numeric component. Use multiple #s to designate a minimum number length. If you track lots for many items, enter as many # signs as you think you'll use in the future. | LOT-##### using leading zeros: LOT-00001234 LOT-#### creates the following numbers: LOT-0001, LOT-0002, ...up to LOT-9999. |
| YY YYYY MM DD | Use the date as part of the numbering format. Indicate a date component by using brackets ([]). You can use a 2- or 4 digit year, (yy or yyyy), 2-digit month (mm), and 2-digit day (dd) | LOT [yy-mm-]##### would appear as: LOT 07-08-00123 (meaning August 2007, lot number 123) |
